Together, we have upheld our commitment to making a significant impact on the lives of our athletes, their families, and the schools and communities we serve. We continued to expand, streamline, and improve our programmatic reach and quality across the state of Ohio. We launched Unified Leadership to teach leaders without disabilities to value and learn from people with intellectual disabilities to create community change. We expanded our statewide partnerships with the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities, The Ohio State University, and the YMCA, along with other critical stakeholders to enhance the quality and accessibility of services for people with intellectual disabilities.

We are continually humbled by our remarkable community of local leaders, volunteers, coaches, and officials. Their selflessness serves as a beacon of inspiration, illuminating the path toward inclusivity, empowerment, and positive change. It is through their tireless efforts and unwavering dedication that our collective mission is realized, touching the lives of countless individuals and enriching our community in immeasurable ways.




Global Youth Leadership Summit

The Special Olympics Global Youth Leadership Summit took place in Berlin, Germany, from June 16-20, 2023. This event was the first global gathering of young people with and without intellectual disabilities since the 2019 GYLS in Abu Dhabi. Notably, it was the first Summit entirely led by youth of all abilities, making it a Summit truly for the youth, by the youth.

Two Unified Pairs from Ohio, Anisha Chopra and Kali Ohlemacher from Sandusky, and Fatimata Sall and Mamie Joe from Columbus, were selected through a rigorous application process. Representing 25% of the USA Delegation, these young women showcased their commitment to inclusion, leadership, and the Unified Generation on a global platform. Their participation highlighted their dedication to building an inclusive future.

The Summit allowed these Youth Leaders to enhance their skills in project management, leadership, and inclusion. They engaged with experts, learned how to accommodate diverse backgrounds, and prepared to bring these lessons back to their communities. The Summit was a treasured opportunity, expanding Unified networks and fostering a deeper understanding of global perspectives.









Sports

We provide 19 Olympic-style individual and team sports that provide meaningful training and competition for 20,000 athletes throughout Ohio.





Winter Games

The 2023 Winter Games marked the third year of indoor winter competition at Bowling Green State University. Over 800 athletes competed in basketball, basketball skills, competitive cheerleading, and swimming. The event also featured an opening ceremony, a dance social event, and free health screenings through the Healthy Athletes program, providing essential health education and resources.












Summer Games

Special Olympics Ohio celebrated its 50th Summer Games on the Ohio State University campus in Columbus with over 3,100 athletes, coaches, and Unified partners from 89 local programs. Competitions included athletics, bocce, bowling, gymnastics, powerlifting, soccer, tennis, and volleyball. The event also featured the Healthy Athletes program, a dance, and an Olympic Village.













Fall Games


The Fall Games spanned elite venues across Ohio in September and October. Events included the State Equestrian Show in Springfield, the State Softball Tournament in Oregon, the State Golf Tournament in Cincinnati, and the State Flag Football Tournament in Geneva. Nearly 700 athletes showcased their skills and competed statewide.













Leadership Summit and Awards

The Leadership Summit and Awards Banquet at Nationwide Hotel and Conference Center recognized athletes, local coordinators, partners and volunteers. Keynote Speaker Loretta Claiborne, Chief Inspiration Officer for Special Olympics, Inc., moved the audience. The Saturday Leadership Conference featured breakout sessions on various topics, such as LETR, Development, Unified Champion Schools, Healthy and Young Athletes, Local Coordinators and Programming, and Training Volunteers and Coaches.


MATTHEW MEDLEY

Data gathered across the US at Healthy Athlete screenings found:

23% of athletes have never had an eye exam

of athletes over the age of 20 are obese. Special Olympics athletes are 2x as likely to become obese versus individuals without intellectual disabilities.

26% of Special Olympics athletes need new prescription for glasses

52% of Special Olympics athletes have gait abnormalities

25% have untreated tooth decay

46% have at least one skin or nail condition







Young Athletes



Special Olympics Ohio's Young Athletes program introduces basic sports skills to children aged 2-7, fostering early childhood development.

In 2023, Special Olympics Ohio made great progress in establishing Young Athletes across the state. In total, 13 new programs were initiated in the community and in schools. The At-Home Young Athletes program was launched with over 175 participants joining in 6 months. A new family engagement initiative known as a Family Health Forum was introduced for families of children in Young Athletes. Professionals in their respective fields were invited to speak on various topics including safety, nutrition, diabetes, and parenting. Overall, this year has seen the most growth for Young Athletes and has set high expectations for the years to come.







Athlete Leadership



Athlete Leadership empowers Special Olympics Ohio athletes to serve as leaders. In 2023, the program saw significant growth with in-person training, Unified Leadership deliveries, and meaningful leadership roles for athletes within the organization.

Athlete Leadership gives our athletes a voice in how they lead and where they lead. The training and experiences these athletes receive result in increased knowledge and transferable/functional skills which will support success in their chosen leadership roles. As athletes grow and succeed, they will share their new-found abilities with teammates, coaches, families and their communities, making for a richer, more inclusive Ohio.











Community Fundraising

Special Olympics Ohio's community collaborations and peer-to-peer fundraising events ensure the expansion and impact of their programs. The Polar Plunge raised over \$603,400, while the Law Enforcement Torch Run and Cleveland Plane Pull also garnered significant support. It takes the whole community to make this happen. We are grateful for the committed individuals, families, and organizations who come together for a more inclusive Ohio by participating in events throughout the year.

POLAR PLUNGE

The Polar Plunge® is our largest fundraising event benefiting Special Olympics Ohio. In order to participate, individuals or teams commit to "Freezin' for a Reason" and collect pledges from friends, family, and colleagues to take the icy plunge!



This year we hosted seven plunges throughout the state, while still offering a Plunge My Way option, and raised over \$603,400.









Community Fundraising

LAW ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN FOR SPECIAL OLYMPICS OHIO

The Law Enforcement Torch Run® is the largest public awareness vehicle and grass-roots fundraiser for Special Olympics. Known as "Guardians of the Flame," law enforcement members and Special Olympics athletes carry the Flame of Hope throughout the state of Ohio and into our Summer Games Opening Ceremonies in unison each year.



Along with the support of hundreds of local law enforcement, athletes, community members and local partners, we hosted 68 Torch Run legs in 2023 and raised \$80,000!







CLEVELAND PLANE PULL

Returning after a three-year hiatus due to COVID, the Cleveland Plane Pull united the community in a powerful, one-of-a-kind fundraising event, challenging teams of 15 people to pull a United 737 aircraft twelve feet across the tarmac! Joining our Presenting Sponsor, Cleveland Hopkins International Airport, over 500 people hit the ropes at the IX Center, raising over \$71,000 for our athletes.

The Special Olympics mission is supported and celebrated throughout Ohio with the help of some truly special community partners. Sheetz has been an exemplary supporter of the movement for inclusion for many years by providing impactful financial contributions, volunteer support at fundraising events and sporting competitions, and opportunities for athlete leaders with every new store opening. Our athletes were able to attend 27 store openings in 2023, and we look forward to many more in the future!

Beyond the store openings, Sheetz has been a longtime supporter of Special Olympics Ohio sports competitions and Polar Plunge events. Countless Sheetz employees take the time to volunteer at events across the state to help provide opportunities for our athletes to compete in the sports they love. Additionally, to ensure our athletes' health and wellness, Sheetz graciously donates \$15,500 worth of healthy drinks and snacks to fuel our athletes at regional and state competitions. This support illustrates the Sheetz team's dedication to promoting healthy lifestyles within the Special Olympics Ohio community
